#### COMMUNITY

Wyoming, a northern Cincinnati suburb, is an upper-middle class residential community with a population of 8,300 residents. The majority of the residents are college graduates who hold executive and professional positions in the greater Cincinnati area. The Wyoming student body reflects varied ethnic, religious, and racial backgrounds. Wyoming High has been ranked as one of the top high schools in the nation by *US News and World Report*, *The Washington Post*, and *Newsweek*. There is a long tradition of a dedication to excellence and the education of the whole student.

#### WYOMING SCHOOL DISTRICT

Presently, Wyoming City Schools have an enrollment of approximately 1940 students in three primary buildings (K-4), a Middle School (5-8), and the High School (9-12). 10 juniors and seniors (.5%) attend one of the four Great Oaks Institute of Technology and Career Development campuses for career and technical education programs. For the class of 2018, 89% of graduates planned on enrolling in four-year colleges and universities and 5% in two-year colleges, technical or professional training programs. Additionally, 1% are pursuing the military, 2% are pursuing employment, and 3% are pursuing gap year opportunities.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Wyoming High School requires a rigorous academic program for all its students. Included among the graduation requirements are **four** credits in English, **four** credits in mathematics, **three** credits in science, and **four** credits in social studies. All sophomores are required to take American Government & Economic Liberty. In addition, all Wyoming High School students must complete required courses in health, physical education, oral communications, and business/technology or foreign language. The importance of fine arts is emphasized for all students.

### CLASS RANK AND ADVANCED COURSEWORK

By policy, Wyoming High School does not rank its students. Since relative weights are assigned to the courses, the maximum grade point average varies with the subjects selected by the students. All Honors classes receive an additional weight of .045 and all AP and College Credit Plus courses receive an additional weight of .09 added onto the GPA.

Honors: Honors English 9 and 10, Honors Plane and Solid Geometry, Honors Algebra II, Honors Precalculus, Honors Human Anatomy and Physiology

AP Courses Offered during the 2018-2019 School Year: AP Language, AP Literature, AP Calculus AB & BC, AP Statistics, AP Chemistry, AP Biology, AP Physics 1, AP Physics C, AP Environmental Science, AP US History, AP World History, AP Psychology, AP Economics Micro & Macro, AP American Government/Politics, AP Comparative Government, AP European History, AP French, AP Latin, AP Spanish, AP Computer Science Principles, AP Computer Programming, AP Art (Photography, 2-D Design or Metals; 3-D Design; Drawing, Painting/Graphic Design). In addition, students who qualify have the opportunity to take college courses off-site or online through the State of Ohio's College Credit Plus Program. These courses receive the additional AP weight.
