

Sixth Grade School Supply List/2021 -2022

- 4 dozen sharpened pencils (3 dozen to be collected)
 - 1 pack of 3 by 5 index cards (to be collected)
 - 2 boxes of tissues (175 count - to be collected)
 - 1 large container of disinfecting wipes (to be collected)
 - 1 pack of blue or black pens
 - 2 red pens
 - 2 large glue sticks
 - 1 box colored pencils
 - 1 zippered pencil bag
 - 1 — 8 (or more)-pocket heavy-duty folder or portfolio (Poly with bindings are more durable than the heavy paper ones)
 - 2 yellow highlighters
 - 1 pair of scissors
 - 1 earbuds
 - 1 stitched composition notebooks (for English)
 - 1 clipboard (for Spanish)
 - 1 - 2 pocket folder (for Spanish)
 - 1 Scientific Calculator TI-30 (This will be used in 7th and 8th grade also.)
 - 1 pack of graph paper (for math)
 - 1 graph paper notebook (for math)
 - 1 - 1 inch black binder (for music - band students need 10 page protectors)
 - 3 Kroger brown paper sacks (Trader Joes and Whole Foods bags are too small)
- Students may want a mouse to use with their ChromeBook.

Once schedules are in hand, please pick up a two-pocket folder for language arts class as outlined below:

- LA bells 1/2: 1 red 2-pocket folder with prongs
- LA bells 4/6: 1 blue 2-pocket folder with prongs
- LA bells 8/9: 1 yellow 2-pocket folder with prongs

*Teachers may have additional items that pertain only to their classes.

Dear Sixth Grade Students and Parents/Caregivers,

We are excited about you coming to the sixth grade! The fifth grade teachers have told us so many wonderful things about you. We are anxious to get back to a more “normal” school year.

Students will get lockers this year. However, lockers are going to be used only to store coats, lunches, and phones. You will still be carrying a backpack with all of your materials in it. You will be limited as to when you may go to your locker. (Basically before school, around lunch, and at the end of the day.) **Parents/caregivers, if you could teach your child how to open a combination lock, we would be ever so grateful!** (They do not need one as the lockers have the combination locks built in. But this is a skill with which kids struggle. They often become very frustrated, so teaching them at home will help avoid that frustration.)

Pick a pocket in your backpack to keep the items you will need everyday. Some items you may want to put in your pencil bag, and then put it into your backpack. Please include your earbuds, a dozen pencils, pens (both red and black or blue), box of colored pencils, a glue stick, scissors, eraser, a highlighter, your calculator, and maybe a mouse. Once you do this, you will have everything you need in one place and be ready to learn!

On the first day, bring your loaded backpack and any items that are marked “to be collected” on the supply list. Your homeroom teacher will collect those for use throughout the school year. Any extra supplies should be kept at home so you can replenish your backpack as needed.

Once labeled, put the 8 pocket in the big pocket of your backpack, and you will be ready to hit the ground running! Getting all your materials organized like this will allow you to have an excellent start to the school year.
