

Wyoming City Schools In-Person Learning Mode Plan

In the first quarter, we learned that school protective protocols could be strictly implemented in Wyoming City Schools. Our protective protocols include the use of home-based daily health screenings, face coverings, social distancing of at least 3 feet, barriers, hand hygiene, and cleaning practices. This In-Person Learning Mode Plan is dependent upon that continuing. It is important to note that school-specific data (case counts and trend, quarantine numbers, staff and student absence rates, etc.) or direction from Hamilton County Public Health or the State of Ohio could cause closures at any time (by class, grade, school, or district-wide).
