B. Approve Superintendent's Report.

VI. Discussion: District Goals Update

Mr. Weber expanded upon the four goal areas:

Teaching and Learning: Curriculum alignment and mapping, Artisan Teacher instructional strategies, and further developing MTSS plans.

Climate and Culture: Implement monthly One Degree Shift conversations focusing on equity, inclusion and belonging; continue to connect the work of the Belonging and Inclusion Collaborative to Wyoming students, staff and community; and create PBIS district plan.

Communication: Create a Wyoming Strategic Plan to guide the short and long-term goal planning for the district; align district and building communication strategies to provide consistent experience for the Wyoming school community; and develop a parent engagement series on critical topics.

Financial Stewardship: Continue to refine budgeting process to be intentional and purposeful in aligning resources to district and building goals and objectives and prioritize resources for PI needs and technology needs in alignment with instructional goals.

VII. Discussion: COVID-19 Update: July 26 – August 2, 2021

Mr. Weber shared an update on the 2021-2022 School Start Plan. He reviewed the foundation for school planning, updated the Hamilton County Cases per 100,000 data as of 8/2/21, reviewed vaccination rates for Hamilton County (49.7%) and Wyoming staff (approximately 80%), and shared an update the Science Advisory Team. The Science Advisory Team update included confirmation of data showing steady increase of COVID-19 levels in our local area, discussion that the Delta variant is more virulent and relentless than what we have previously experienced in COVID – resulting in the need to respect past data but understand it does not represent true picture of Delta variant, acknowledgement that public health guidance (supported by medical specialists) is for full masking while indoors, understanding of the critical need for continued progress with vaccinations, and the impact of masking on limiting quarantine for close contacts. Next steps including a recommendation and communication of any plan changes, specifically for masking and quarantine, at the August 6 BOE. Special Meeting.

Mrs. Zoller seconded the motion.


